 - A. SUPPORTING DETAILS: Write 2-3 sentences** that inform the reader about one element related to the topic. Consider answering one of the questions from your thesis development worksheet.
 - TRANSITION: Indicate the shift from your 1st support to your 2nd support. The transition may be as little one word that you will eventually attach as a sentence opener below (B) or as much as an entire transition sentence.
 - B. SUPPORTING DETAILS: Write 2-3 sentences** that inform the reader about a second element related to the topic. Consider answering a second question from your thesis development worksheet.
 - C. CONCLUDING SENTENCE (& Possible Bridge*): Bring the paragraph's topic to a close (and possibly transition or bridge to the next paragraph's topic).
